# A Celebration of Life

Ronna Bazerman was born to Rose and William Bazerman on June 30, 1951, the first of 2 children in the family. Ronna was excellent in school – for at least as long as she tolerated the institution. Ronna returned to Pittsburgh in her twenties, and eventually pursued a career in cancer research at University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. During this time she earned her undergraduate degree from the University of Pittsburgh.

But, all who knew Ronna knew that her life's passion was the world of tournament bridge. Whether it was playing as a life master, running regional or national bridge tournaments, or serving on the Board of Governors and the District and Unit Boards of the American Contract Bridge League, Ronna was a leader and organizer. Along the way, she developed hundreds of friendships.

On March 18, 2006, Ronna married Charles Atkins, formalizing a loving relationship that had lasted decades. In the process, she became the mother to Rosalind Atkins-Green and Denise Atkins, the grandmother to Keera Atkins, Keona Southern, Adrian Atkins, and Erin Atkins, and a great-grandmother to four.

Ronna's life is also celebrated by her brother

Max Bazerman and sister-in-law Marla Felcher, her surviving aunts, Belle, Marion, Freda and Leona, many cousins, hundreds of friends, and her beloved chocolate lab Willie (named after Ronna and Max's father).

To those who knew her, it will be no surprise to learn that Ronna left our world on her own terms. She loved life, and was devastated when she learned that she was terminally ill. Yet, in the end, Ronna ultimately was in control of what happened. She did things her way.

Ronna was a very special person up until the very end.

# Akron Alert *by Jim Sullivan*

**AUTUMN SECTIONAL** – The Autumn Sectional will be held at the Tadmor Temple on October 3-4-5. For the KO team players there will be the popular Three Session Bracketed Handicap KO Team event, with the first session at 7:00 p.m. on Friday and the final two sessions on Saturday. Stratified Open Pairs and Stratified 499ers Pairs sessions will also be held on Friday and Saturday. The Friday sessions will be at 1:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Times for the Saturday sessions will be 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. This should still allow players time for Saturday night social events. The Sunday event will be a Stratified Swiss Team Game starting at 11:00 a.m. The calculations for the Swiss Team Strats will be the average of the four players with the highest Master Points. This is the same formula that is used in Bracketing.

**IMP LEAGUE FOR 2008-2009** – The form will be the same as last year with 2 sessions; the first 4 night session ends in December so that those who go south can participate. The 2008 Fall session started on September 19, with the remaining matches to be held October 17, November 14 and December 5. If you missed the 2008 Fall session, you can still sign up for the four night 2009 Winter session which will be held January 23, February 20, and March 13 & 27.

**MENTOR PROGRAM CELEBRATION** – A Mentor/Mentee celebration game will be held on October 24. All mentees can play at half price. Mentor's will need to play with a mentee in order to play at half price. The game will be open to all players. Pizza will be provided for the game. If you wish to bring something to add, feel free to do so.

**2008-2009 MENTOR/MENTEE PROGRAM** – October 31 will mark the beginning of the 3rd year for the Mentor/Mentee program. Signup for the 2008-2009 mentee program will begin October 31. Everyone will be required to sign up. 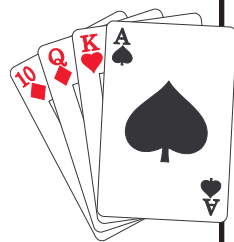
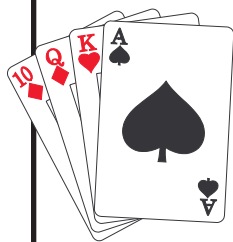

She was on the ACBL Good Will and Charity Committees. She

was also among the first in our hearts. She was a loving wife, daughter, sister, mother, grandmother and friend. We extend our sympathy to all. She is missed. One thing that Roni established was the practice that if we wanted to name games after our bridge playing friends, we would pay for the privilege. I'd like to start this month's report with a sincere thanks to all those who helped to make our sectional in July a great success. The food, as always, was delicious and plentiful. Numerous people have told me that our tournament has the best food. Everybody really came through. Additional special thanks to those people who helped before, during and after the tournament with all the various tasks that can just become overwhelming. While I was still really busy this year, I also felt the most relaxed because there were enough volunteers to ensure that everything ran smoothly.

Several of our players also had bridge success at the tournament. **Ellie** and **John Scalzo** came in first in Flight B in Saturday afternoon's Open Pairs. On Sunday, **Sheila Rabovsky**, **Joan Wickerham**, **Helen Dunn** and **Kathryn Ekker** finished first in C in the Swiss teams.

In other tournament news, **Henry Nelson** has done very well this summer. He had some top finishes in Flight B at the Hunt Valley regional, but his biggest successes came at the Summer NABC's in Las Vegas. Playing in the 0-5000 Life Master Pairs, a six session, three day event with two cuts, Henry and his partner finished third. Later in the tournament, his team finished fifteenth in the national Senior Swiss Teams. The Labor Day Regional in Monroeville is ongoing as this article is being written. Several 229'ers have already had some top finishes so there should be plenty to write about in the next article.

We held our first unit game at its new location, the Beaver Valley YMCA, located in New Brighton. Everybody was impressed with the playing area and many people commented that they really liked the new start time of 6 P.M. We should all express our thanks to **Mary Lou Ford**, **George Cross**

and the others who were instrumental in locating and securing the new site. Also, thanks go out to **Bill Blank** who stored and transported all of our supplies during the move. The winners at the August game were **John Samarco** and **Barbara Bellino**. The E/W winners were **Beverly** and **George Spine**.

Since it's football season, it is only appropriate that the Best New Convention winner is called the Fumblerewski. How many times have you made a slam try and ended up going down one trick at the five level when partner had a minimum for his previous bidding? The Fumblerewski provides a safe and effective method of avoiding this. Here's how it works. Suppose your suit is hearts and you would like to make a mild slam try safely. Take the 4S bid from the bidding box and place it on or near the table. Then quickly say, "Oh, I meant to bid 4H's." Mechanical errors with the bidding box are correctable without penalty, so even though the director will know you're lying through your teeth and your opponents will know they are getting jobbed, they won't be able to do anything about it. Now, if your partner is at the top of their bid or has unusual and unexpected distribution, he can cuebid or bid Blackwood as he feels is appropriate. For other suits, just pull out the bid which is one higher than the suit you have agreed on. Advanced players may also use the bid under their suit to show other hand types. For a full explanation of the Fumblerewski and its applications in a wide variety of auctions, please send for the book, *The Art of Fumblerewski*, published by Plagiarist Press. 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# A STaC is a Sectional Tournament at Clubs.

## This is how it works:

A **STaC** is a SECTIONAL Tournament — but the sections take place at individual clubs, instead of together at one large location.

Each game at a participating club may be part of the tournament.

The results of the game you play in are combined with the results from all of the other clubs and an OVERALL will be tallied for each session and game type.

For example: Olean, Canton, Greensburg, Cumberland and Parkersburg all play at the same time. Scoring is first done on a club-by-club basis and SILVER points awarded for each section. Then the results of all five games are combined as if everyone were playing under one roof. Highest percentage score is first overall, next is second overall, and so forth. Because you are competing against so many people, you can earn a lot of points. All of them, whether they are section awards or overall awards, will be SILVER. Yes, it will cost a little more to play in a STaC game. ACBL sanction fees are higher and a director must be paid to coordinate the gathering and issuing of points.

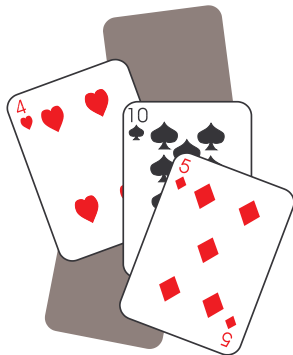
